You shall have no other gods before me. – Exodus 20:3

Ken's Komments

Our hymns for Sunday worship:

"The Lord Is God" paraphrases the *Shema* (Deuteronomy 6:4-9), an ancient and central affirmation of Jewish monotheistic faith. Jesus knew it well and called it the first and greatest commandment (Matthew 22:38). The tune is the familiar AZMON (O for a Thousand Tongues to Sing).

"Jesu, Jesu, Fill Us With Your Love" is sung to the Ghanian folk song tune CHEREPONI. The text was written by a missionary to Ghana, Tom Colvin, after a meeting of evangelists at Chereponi in northern Ghana, led by Presbyterian missionaries Al Drass and Bob Thelin. It is a statement of commitment and servant-hood, and reflects Jesus' words "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Tom Colvin collected the tune at Chereponi in northern Ghana and adapted it for use with this hymn, and gave it the appropriate name of CHEREPONI.

"Jesus Call Us" is a familiar hymn of discipleship and commitment. It was written and published in 1852 by Cecil Frances Alexander in "Hymns for Public Worship." It was originally written for "St. Andrew's Day." "St. Andrew's Day" is a national holiday in Scotland that is celebrated with feasts on November 30. It is also Scotland's national day, marking the beginning of Scotland as a nation. I would consider it like our July 4 celebrations.
